The Hokkaido Powder Belt ski fields of Furano, Tomamu, Kamui, Asahidake and Kurodake are synonymous with superb quality powder snow and provide a wide variety of terrain from family cruisers to backcountry areas. With a total of 5 mountains to choose from you can easily turn your ski holiday into a multi resort experience. Return transportation and guided day trips from Furano to Hokkaido Powder Belt ski areas are available.

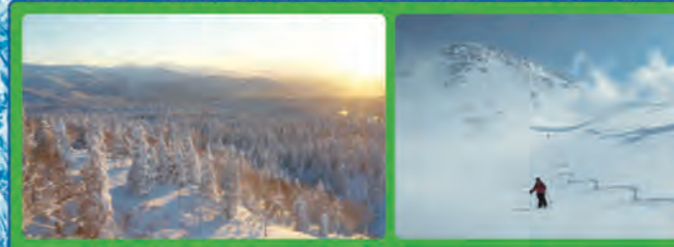
Daisetsuzan Sounkyo-Kurodake

Nestled amongst the Daisetsuzan Mountain Range, this ski course spreads out across the NE face of Mt. Kurodake. This area is well known for its huge mountains, spectacular views, and amazing powder snow. The course starts out steep, but gradually tapers into a more gentle slope. The ski area is open from the beginning of November through the middle of May, so you can ski for six months out of the year. Between March and May, there's still enough snow to enjoy some great spring skiing.



Mt. Asahidake

This live smoking volcano offers one of Japan's most extreme ski experiences. The 101 person tram transports skiers up to the top from where two runs descend the mountain. As the highest peak in Hokkaido, Asahidake is renowned for its amazing amounts of deep dry fluffy powder. This is not a mountain to explore on one's own and it is highly recommended to ski with a guide.



Hoshino Resorts TOMAMU

Tomamu is a fully self-contained ski resort with 25 ski courses, 2 hotels, Japan's largest indoor wave pool, an Ice Village and an enormous snow fun area. With the new quad lift, "Powder Express", in operation this winter, powder lovers can have easy access to un-groomed runs and tree areas. The one and only "Ice Village" and the indoor wave pool add fun for the whole family. Getting to Tomamu is easy with New Chitose Airport only 2 hours away by direct bus and access by JR train also possible.

Kamui Ski Links

Kamui is a popular local mountain with steep and challenging terrain, but it is also known for its wide trails that allow beginners to attempt most runs. Kamui takes an open approach to its back country and tree skiing, and the easily-accessed powder is the main reason advanced skiers travel here. Kamui is only 30 minutes from downtown Asahikawa, and day tours are a popular option from Furano on the shuttle bus service.



Furano Ski Resort

Furano, the little town with a big ski resort, is the focal point of the Hokkaido Powder Belt. Furano offers world class ski terrain, where more World Cup competitions have been held than anywhere else in Japan. Furano is well known for its bluebird days, calm weather and stunning views. Terrain includes family areas, impeccably groomed rollers, and steep powder sections. The traditional town at the base of the mountain is a great place to explore at the end of the day.
